

Please find the requested summary and let us know if you have any questions.

The cultural resources on the Air Park site are significant because:

• The age of the structure is important (pre civil war).

- Site integrity is intact and hasn't been disturbed much over the years which is a contributing factor.
- Dutton believes there is a link between the site and Merry Oaks Tavern, stating
 the site is likely the location of one of the owners of Merry Oaks Tavern. So
 while it is not the actual tavern, there is a correlation.
- As a rule of thumb, if a site is pre civil and has good integrity (mostly intact),
 DHR will definitely have interest in it. Additionally, if post-civil war and African American, DHR will also have interest in the site.

The below bullets provide the anticipated DHR timeline. This is a compressed timeline and will need help with timely reviews from DHR and the COE along the way. We identified 3 times (underlined below) where the state's assistance would be beneficial:

- Dec 11 or 12: We would like to have a phone conference with the COE, DHR,
 Timmons, Dutton, and John Lain next week. <u>Following the Governor's</u>
 announcement of the project, we believe it would be helpful for the Governor's
 office to emphasize the importance of timely reviews to DHR.
- Dec 20 Jan 10: MOA is submitted for review on 12/20, based on the holiday period and allowing for review time, we anticipate receiving the first set of review comments by 1/10. We believe around January 2 would be a good time for the Governor's office and VEDP to request a quick review of the MOA by DHR.
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- 31 Jan Feb 14: During this time the recovery plan will be reviewed for approval. We believe this would be a good time for the Governor's office and VEDP to assist to ensure the review process is completed quickly.
- **Feb 14:** Receive recovery plan approval. This is the date that section 106 coordination should be complete.
- Feb 17- Late April: Recovery field work and coordination takes place.
- May 1: Cultural Resource activity will be complete...ready to go.

Doug,

We wanted to follow up our phone call today with some additional information regarding the Cultural Resource work to be completed on the Site. First, I spoke with David Dutton (Dutton + Associates) this afternoon. He stated that he will immediately proceed to setting up a conference call with his team, John Lain, Timmons, DHR, and the Corps of Engineers to outline our course of action. This morning we provided him the information he would need to draft the Memorandum of Agreement, so we have

already initiated the process. He said a draft MOA should only take him a week to pull together.

While he stated his Phase I report would be complete just prior to the holidays, he did give me some insight as to what they are discovering on the site that is leading this next course of action. David said that it appears the "smear" of artifacts are not only tied to the previously discovered structure, but also a late 18th early 19th century out building and two wells. He stated these are the areas in which they are finding strong concentrations. Of course his formal Phase I will provide further clarification but just wanted everyone to have an idea of what we were talking about.

He also agrees that any kind of influence that can be asserted during the process will be incredibly helpful. That influence would likely be most impactful in speeding up reviewing times with the agencies. That being said, the Corps of Engineers PM and likely DHR reviewer contact information can be found below.

Provided below is a summary derived from emails and phone calls with David Dutton regarding the next steps in the process to address the cultural resource issue. The good thing is the majority of the work can be done concurrently, with the worst case scenario being timeline of **5.5 months**, as we discussed on the call today.

Summary

Site 44HN0326, shown in the attachment was the subject of archaeological excavations by Gray & Pape in 1999. The purpose was to conclusively determine whether or not the site was the location of Merry Oaks Tavern. Gray & Pape concluded that the site was not Merry Oaks Tavern as the size of the structure foundations differed from those of the Tavern as recorded on a Mutual Assurance Society policy map from 1813. They recommended no further work on the site given the date of the artifacts recovered (19th century). They did not conduct their study beyond the immediate vicinity of the identified structure, thus did not proceed further into the site.

While the 1999 work conducted by Gray & Pape focused on a small area of the site, Dutton + Associates Phase I obviously covered a much larger area. During their phase I, Dutton's team discovered what he described as an artifact "smear" that extended into the site much further than the polygon mapped in VCRIS. The area of this "smear" is

sketched in the second attachment. Based on D+A's Phase I findings, and given their experience with Virginia Department of Historic Resources (VDHR) over the past several years it is their opinion that the odds are greater that VDHR will recommend the site eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) if a formal Phase II evaluation study were completed. That stated, they have outlined the best path forward based on the project's associated timelines. This path forward outlines the treatment of Site 44HN0326, and next steps.

Assuming Site 44HN0326 is eligible for listing in the NRHP, total duration until area is released for construction is approximately 5.5 months (worst case).

Next Steps

Draft Memorandum of Agreement, Drafting duration one week, duration for consultation and execution of MOA (worst case 90 days).

Draft MOA for Corps, permit applicant, and VDHR that stipulates data recovery of Site 44HN0326. Draft MOA is submitted to VDHR and the Corps for review and comment. The agencies will take 30 days to provide comments. Once received, comments will be addressed within three business days and the MOA resubmitted. Assuming no additional comments, the Corps will submit the draft MOA to Norfolk for processing and signature. VDHR will not sign the MOA until the Corps has signed the document. Normally this may take 45-60 days for this to occur. The executed MOA will be attached to the Corps permit as a condition.

Concurrent with the MOA process above, Dutton + Associates will complete boundary delineation testing to conclusively define limits of the site and focus for data recovery. The scope of work will include close interval shovel testing (25-foot intervals) across the entire site to establish the horizontal limits of the site. Artifact data will be plotted using surfer software to define artifact concentrations. A memorandum discussing the testing and results will be prepared and submitted as an addendum to the completed Phase I survey, which will be provided to VDHR for review and comment in support of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) wetland permit application.

Data Recovery of Site 44HN0326 (Duration of fieldwork worst case 10 weeks)

Draft data recovery plan will be prepared during drafting period of MOA (duration two weeks). Final data recovery plan submitted to VDHR and Corps for review and approval during signature process for MOA. Once approved, data recovery of the site will commence. Fieldwork is expected to be completed within 10 weeks of initiation. A completion of fieldwork memorandum will be prepared within two weeks and submitted to the Corps and VDHR. Once the completion of fieldwork memorandum has been accepted, the site is released to the permit holder for construction. Data analysis and reporting will continue for approximately 6 months after which a draft report of the data recovery excavations will be provided.

That influence would likely be most impactful in speeding up reviewing times with the agencies. That being said, the Corps of Engineers PM and likely DHR reviewer contact information can be found below.

Provided below is a summary derived from emails and phone calls with David Dutton regarding the next steps in the process to address the cultural resource issue. The good thing is the majority of the work can be done concurrently, with the worst case scenario being timeline of **5.5 months**, as we discussed on the call today.

Summary

Site 44HN0326, shown in the attachment was the subject of archaeological excavations by Gray & Pape in 1999. The purpose was to conclusively determine whether or not the site was the location of Merry Oaks Tavern. Gray & Pape concluded that the site was not Merry Oaks Tavern as the size of the structure foundations differed from those of the Tavern as recorded on a Mutual Assurance Society policy map from 1813. They recommended no further work on the site given the date of the artifacts recovered (19th century). They did not conduct their study beyond the immediate vicinity of the identified structure, thus did not proceed further into the site.

While the 1999 work conducted by Gray & Pape focused on a small area of the site, Dutton + Associates Phase I obviously covered a much larger area. During their phase I, Dutton's team discovered what he described as an artifact "smear" that extended into the site much further than the polygon mapped in VCRIS. The area of this "smear" is sketched in the second attachment. Based on D+A's Phase I findings, and given their experience with Virginia Department of Historic Resources (VDHR) over the past several years it is their opinion that the odds are greater that VDHR will recommend the site eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) if a formal Phase II evaluation study were completed. That stated, they have outlined the best path forward based on the project's associated timelines. This path forward outlines the treatment of Site 44HN0326, and next steps.

Assuming Site 44HN0326 is eligible for listing in the NRHP, total duration until area is released for construction is approximately 5.5 months (worst case).

Next Steps

Draft Memorandum of Agreement, Drafting duration one week, duration for consultation and execution of MOA (worst case 90 days).

Draft MOA for Corps, permit applicant, and VDHR that stipulates data recovery of Site 44HN0326. Draft MOA is submitted to VDHR and the Corps for review and comment. The agencies will take 30 days to provide comments. Once received, comments will be addressed within three business days and the MOA resubmitted. Assuming no additional comments, the Corps will submit the draft MOA to Norfolk for processing and signature. VDHR will not sign the MOA until the Corps has signed the document. Normally this may take 45-60 days for this to occur. The executed MOA will be attached to the Corps permit as a condition.

Concurrent with the MOA process above, Dutton + Associates will complete boundary delineation testing to conclusively define limits of the site and focus for data recovery. The scope of work will include close interval shovel testing (25-foot intervals) across the entire site to establish the horizontal limits of the site. Artifact data will be plotted using surfer software to define artifact concentrations. A memorandum discussing the testing and results will be prepared and submitted as an addendum to the completed Phase I survey, which will be provided to VDHR for review and comment in support of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) wetland permit application.

Data Recovery of Site 44HN0326 (Duration of fieldwork worst case 10 weeks)

Draft data recovery plan will be prepared during drafting period of MOA (duration two weeks). Final data recovery plan submitted to VDHR and Corps for review and approval during signature process for MOA. Once approved, data recovery of the site will commence. Fieldwork is expected to be completed within 10 weeks of initiation. A completion of fieldwork memorandum will be prepared within two weeks and submitted to the Corps and VDHR. Once the completion of fieldwork memorandum has been accepted, the site is released to the permit holder for construction. Data analysis and reporting will continue for approximately 6 months after which a draft report of the data recovery excavations will be provided.

We have had several calls with the executive team at DEQ on the wetlands delineation issue for Project Tiger. At this point, DEQ has no reason to be worried about the Army Corp Jurisdictional Determination on the wetlands delineation. I understand from our DEQ contacts that the original wetlands delineation for the Airpark site was conducted several years ago and submitted and reviewed by the Army Corp. The delineation was re-submitted recently to the Corp for re-review and no new concerns were identified.

Minor impacts to the weltands that have already been identified and reviewed by the Army Corp are very small. These impacts would qualify for DEQ's general wetlands permit. DEQ cannot issue the permit until the wetlands permit application is submitted and DEQ walks the site. While I know you would prefer the site visit not occur, DEQ has no reason to think there will be any findings that are not consistent with the Army Corp's current Jurisdictional Determination. Our DEQ contact also indicated you should not be concerned with the excessive rain we have received—this would not have an impact on the findings to the delineated wetlands.

I hope this helps, but please let me or Lindsay know if you have any questions or need additional information.

We spoke with Hirschler and McGuire Woods last week (July 8th) and have set the following in motion:

From Paul Davenport at Hirschler:

Good morning Tim. RK&K is getting mobilized. I met with Malachi Mills on Tuesday morning to discuss re-flagging the site for the current delineation. He met with his wetlands crew, and called back yesterday to confirm that RK&K will, on behalf of the seller and at the seller's expense, re-flag the previous RK&K delineation. When their first delineation was done in 2013, it was surveyed by Rod Shadrach (Shadrach & Associates, who does survey work on a contract basis for RK&K). In 2018, Laura Dixon added about a half an acre of new wetlands that is part of the delineation submitted to the Corps in 2018. That additional wetland area was located by GPS coordinates, and not surveyed, but Malachi says there is sufficient information in their file to permit Shadrach to re-flag both the area that he surveyed in 2013 and the area that was added in 2018 by GPS coordinates. Malachi is contacting Shadrach to get the work started and to find out Shadrach's schedule. As part of the job for the seller, RK&K will also do a site visit to confirm that Shadrach's re-flagging is consistent with RK&K's

records. Malachi understands that we need to have this done as quickly as possible. I will let you know about the scheduling as soon as I hear back from Malachi. Please let me know if you have any the questions in the meantime.

- Once we hear from Paul this is complete, Timmons Group will Schedule a Pre-App meeting with COE only (not DEQ) to get their confirmation of the past delineation. Seller will participate in this meeting
- Assuming 2 goes well, Timmons Group will schedule meeting with DEQ claiming the COE has confirmed the delineation. Seller will participate in this meeting to help gain DEQ acceptance of delineation.

We have had several calls with the executive team at DEQ on the wetlands delineation issue for Project Tiger. At this point, DEQ has no reason to be worried about the Army Corp Jurisdictional Determination on the wetlands delineation. I understand from our DEQ contacts that the original wetlands delineation for the Airpark site was conducted several years ago and submitted and reviewed by the Army Corp. The delineation was re-submitted recently to the Corp for re-review and no new concerns were identified.

Minor impacts to the weltands that have already been identified and reviewed by the Army Corp are very small. These impacts would qualify for DEQ's general wetlands permit. DEQ cannot issue the permit until the wetlands permit application is submitted and DEQ walks the site. While I know you would prefer the site visit not occur, DEQ has no reason to think there will be any findings that are not consistent with the Army Corp's current Jurisdictional Determination. Our DEQ contact also indicated you should not be concerned with the excessive rain we have received—this would not have an impact on the findings to the delineated wetlands.
